The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) acknowledges receipt of the Department of the Air Force (AF) report on the loss of Hazardous, Toxic Waste and Storage Tank Management records.

According to the report, one box was lost in transit from the 305 Aerial Port Squadron, Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, New Jersey to the Washington National Records Center (WNRC) in Suitland, Maryland. Several attempts were made to locate the missing box but the records were not recovered. The 39th Air Base Wing Base Records Manager now considers the records lost.

Based on the information provided, the reporting requirements of 36 CFR 1230.14(a) have been met and NARA considers this matter closed. I appreciate your attention on this important matter.
